Located in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, much of the city's early economic development leaned on agriculture and the tourist trade. While these continue to be very important to the economy, the past 10 years have seen an impressive level of expansion in knowledge-based industries including: **Aerospace, Information Technology, Food Processing, and Manufacturing.**

Summerside provides companies with a competitive business environment where key location sensitive costs such as real estate and labour are significantly lower than most North American markets.

Summerside's proposition for business development includes:

- Central PEI location with a trade area population of 45,000 – 35% of the Island market share
- Proximity to larger markets – Summerside's strong infrastructure network connects business to a market in excess of 22 million people all within a day's drive.
- Transportation links – international airport, deep water port, and proximity to Confederation Bridge (20 minutes)
- Skilled, dedicated & available workforce – demonstrated capacity for attracting and retaining core talent
- Tax Free Zones, Tailored Incentive Packages, Research & Development Clusters for specific sectors
- High quality of life for employees

- Federal Corporate Tax Rate 19%
- Federal Small Business Corporate Tax 11%
- Provincial Corporate Tax Rate (small Business) 2.1%
- Provincial Corporate Tax Rate (other Business) 16%
- Provincial Commercial Property Tax Rate \$1.50 per \$100 of Assessment
- Municipal Commercial Property Tax Rate \$1.92 per \$100 of Assessment
- Average Industrial Land Price \$12,000/acre
- A full annual rebate on all provincial taxes for aviation related business operating in Slemon Park
- 10 year tax rebate program for export-focused manufacturers or value added service providers
- 35% Scientific research and investment tax credit
- 10% Manufacturing equipment and machinery tax credit
